

Three Small Arts Organizations Selected for Support by The Community Foundation Recipients are Florida Ballet at Jacksonville, Hope at Hand and St. Johns County Cultural Council

JACKSONVILLE, Florida – April 1, 2015 — The Community Foundation for Northeast Florida is pleased to announce that it has awarded three Art Ventures Small Arts Professional Development grants. The recipients are:

The Florida Ballet at Jacksonville was awarded \$2,500 to fund two of its Conservatory and Training teachers to continue certification in the American Ballet Theatre Training Curriculum in New York, NY.

Hope at Hand, which provides art and poetry therapy to women, children and elders in crisis, received \$2,500 to send five therapists to the National Association of Poetry Therapy conference in Black Mountain, NC.

The St. Johns County Cultural Council received \$2,500 to support a marketing workshop for artists presented by the National Arts Marketing Program and Americans for the Arts.

The Community Foundation for Northeast Florida invests in Professional Development as a way to develop sustainable organizational practices. The grants are given to small arts organizations for training, conferences, coaching, and other opportunities in order to help them build capacity as nonprofit leaders.
