



George Egan and Buddy Schulz, Jr. Join The Community Foundation's Board of Trustees

JACKSONVILLE, Florida – January 14, 2019—The Community Foundation for Northeast Florida has added George M. Egan and George E. ‘Buddy’ Schulz, Jr. to its Board of Trustees, effective January 1, 2019. Each will serve a three year term. Mr. Egan and Mr. Schulz replace Peggy Bryan and Paul Perez, who began their service to the Board of Trustees in 2009, fulfilling three terms each before retiring from the Board at the end of 2018. The Board of Trustees has also selected Trustee Martha Frye Baker as chair-elect; her term as Board Chair will begin in January 2020.

George M. Egan is President and Chief Executive Officer of the Reinhold Corporation, a family owned timber/land management and investment holding company. Prior to Reinhold, Mr. Egan spent nearly 20 years as an investment banker in New York City and Pittsburgh. He received his BA from Yale University and an MBA from the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth College.

Mr. Egan currently serves as a Director of the Reinhold Corporation, Shadowlawn Farms and Huelman People Solutions, LLC. He is the current Chair of the Clay County Economic Development Corporation and of the St. Mark's Episcopal Church Foundation, and is a Trustee of The Paul E. & Klare N. Reinhold Foundation. Formerly, he served as Chair of the St. Mark's Episcopal Day School Board and as a Trustee of the Pittsburgh Children's Institute and of Shady Side Academy. Since 2014, Mr. Egan has been a member of the Investment Committee of The Community Foundation for Northeast Florida.

George E. "Buddy" Schulz Jr. is a partner in Holland & Knight's Jacksonville office and is a Florida Bar Board Certified trial lawyer. His practice has involved him in litigation throughout the United States since 1973. He is the past chairman of Holland & Knight's litigation department, and he presently is the Chair of the Public and Charitable Service Department, which coordinates the Firm's pro bono and community initiatives that assists persons of limited means and organizations that help them. He is a recipient of the Florida Bar Pro Bono Service Award.

Mr. Schulz has served as a cabinet member of United Way; general counsel of PACE Center for Girls/Jacksonville; a director of Jacksonville Area Legal Aid, Inc.; a director of the Jacksonville Urban League; a member of the City of Jacksonville Ethics Commission; a member of the City of Jacksonville Juvenile Justice Comprehensive Strategy Board; and a member of the Gator Bowl Association. He is presently a volunteer to the Guardian Ad Litem program, a trustee emeritus of the University of Florida Levin College of Law and a member of Florida Blue Key. Mr. Schulz earned his law degree following military service as a lieutenant in the United States Navy during the Vietnam War.

“We are honored to be joined by both George Egan and Buddy Schulz, both of whom are not only respected professionals but lauded community stewards,” commented Ryan Schwartz, chairman of the Foundation's Board of Trustees. “While we will greatly miss both Peggy and Paul, we are confident that the presence of George and Buddy will provide us with expanded perspective and knowledge.”
